## A Message from the Village News Team

Thank you to all who responded so positively in the summer to the request for feedback about the future of the Parish News. And also a very grateful thank you for donations for the magazine this month from Anne Michael, Sandra Burns, Alciston and Selmeston Flower Show and Jonathan Chiswell Jones.

As you can see, there have been some changes - not least that the Parish News has become the Village News.

Most people don't realise that the magazine, although it contains information about church services and a piece each month from our local priests, Peter Blee and Shirley Pearce, is not a 'church magazine' per se. In fact, the magazine is independently produced and financed through the advertising subscriptions and the generous donations of those who read it.

Following the loss of advertisers and a decrease in income over the last year, it became necessary to review the production of the magazine.

Although there are so many ways to communicate electronically these days, it was clear from the feedback received that individuals still appreciate having a physical copy of the magazine. In order to do this, and to be able to continue to distribute a free copy to all residents\* in Alciston, Berwick and Selmeston, tough decisions were needed to cut production costs.

So the obvious question as you hold this new magazine in your hands is: 'How can the magazine now be produced in full colour and yet save money?'

For many decades the Parish News has been printed locally, alongside the Arlington Scene, by Pauline Jackson and Wendy Holmes, and we have been very grateful for their timely and conscientious efforts. Somewhat inevitably, however, and in order to allow additional flexibility in the production of the magazine's content and advertising, it is now significantly cheaper to produce the magazine using an on-line publishing company. But this change also means that it is now possible to include more villagebased news and information. And this is where your input is welcomed. If you live in the villages and have a seasonal picture for the front cover (portrait format preferred) or an interesting update, activity or article, recipe even, etc., then please feel free to submit it; the cut-off date for contributions is the 15<sup>th</sup> of the previous month.

The November cover picture is courtesy of Peter Blee. Contact details are at the front of the magazine. Obviously, we want to keep the content village/benefice-focused and, as far as possible, a-political, whilst still giving our elected representatives the opportunity to provide feedback on their activities.

Income from advertising still provides the majority of funding for the magazine, so if you know of anyone who might like to advertise, or to include your own business, etc., details of the advertising costs are given at the back of the magazine. In addition to quarter page adverts it is now possible to include full- and halfpage adverts.

Don't forget you can plant Garlic and Broad Beans this month, so they will have a great start in the spring.

Rake up all the leaves you can for the compost heap, if you have a rotary mower try running over them to break them up and you will find they will compost down quicker.

Check the onions to see if any are rotten. If they are, throw them away, the same with potatoes.

Don't forget to raise your mower up for the last cut of the year!

### Recipe of the Month -Chocolate Chip Fudge Brownies

### Ingredients

225g butter

100-120g cooking chocolate

400g caster sugar

4 eggs, separated

200-250g flour

1 tsp vanilla extract

100g chocolate chips

#### Method

Preheat oven to 160°C/ gas mark 3. Melt butter and cooking chocolate over medium heat and stir until

over medium heat and stir until smooth. Remove from the heat, combine the sugar.

Add egg yolks and vanilla and mix well.

Add flour until the mixture is very thick. Add chocolate chips and mix well.

Beat egg whites until stiff and peaked and then fold in gently.

Spread in a greased 10 x 15 inch baking tin and bake for 25-30 minutes.

Allow to cool, cut into required slices and then place in the fridge for at least 2 hours, or ideally overnight as this makes them more fudgy.

## **Local Planning**

Planning once again is dominating the local news in our parishes and towns. While we have had success in seeing our greenfield sites protected because planning committees have refused to allow development on sites not in neighbourhood plans, we are now seeing these decisions being overturned by planning inspectors.

Both in Wealden and Lewes we have seen sites such as South Road in Wivelsfield and Mornings Mill in Polegate have their refusals overruled by planning inspectors and overturning the decisions of democratically elected local planning committees. The concern is with appeals on sites such as Nolands in Plumpton and a number in Ringmer, coming up, that these will suffer the same fate and I have raised this in Parliament as this is not acceptable.

The planning inspectors give reasons for their decisions and the crux of the matter is that neither Wealden or Lewes District councils have Local Plans that are in date and so the protection of the neighbourhood plans on greenfield sites falls. I have been urging both district councils to get their plans in date for a long time now so that we have the legal protection they offer.

While the debate about housing numbers rages on, without any local plan there is no protection at all and whether the housing numbers are 2 or 2002 currently there is open season

## **Energy Support Scams**

Beware of scam texts offering you fake government energy bill support. As energy bills rise, scammers are seeking to take advantage of unsuspecting consumers. Their latest trick involves sending a malicious text message link that asks you to sign up for the government's energy grant.

In the past fraudsters have called up households pretending to be from their council before asking for card details to make a £150 energy rebate payment.

Sometimes scammers impersonate Ofgem through emails, texts and websites, which ask people to enter their banking details to qualify for fake energy refunds.

The latest energy scam capitalises on the fact that the government's £400 energy grant is now being rolled out. If you get one of these texts, don't click on the link. Your grant will be applied to your energy account automatically.

### **Polecat**



For most of us, our only encounters with British mammals are spotting them on the roadside as we hurtle past at 55 mph. I'm sure many people these days believe that lying motionless on a road verge with its feet in the air is natural behaviour for a Badger.

Our road trips may be macabre safaris, but roadkill can tell us a lot about the state of our island's mammalian fauna. Hedgehogs, a squashed staple on the roadkill menu a few decades ago, are now hard to find flattened on the highway, reflecting their dramatic fall in numbers in the wider countryside. And recently an unfamiliar corpse has appeared on the tarmac: the Polecat.

Before being killed by cars, Polecats already had a long history of persecution in England - mainly for eating poultry and notoriously stinking to high heaven. To Shakespeare, and many others since, 'Polecat' was an insult. The species was exterminated from Sussex around 1890. Indeed, the entire English population was banished to the wilderness of Wales. Yet we were happy to welcome their watered-down, domesticated form - the Ferret - as cuddly pets and ruthless Rabbit hunters.

After a century in exile, purebred Polecats are making a comeback. This re-colonisation was the basis for a recent investigation by the Vincent Wildlife Trust who requested roadkill Polecat corpses for DNA testing to verify their pure Polecat lineage (as opposed to Polecat/Ferret hybrids). I was soon dodging traffic on the Steyning by-pass and excitedly picking up a dead Polecat. Being mustelids, Polecats naturally smell but, take my word for it, they smell a lot worse when they've been dead for a few days. Despite discharging a whole can of Glade, my wife smelt that something was up seconds after I set foot in the house.

Putting a dead Polecat in your freezer will test even the strongest of marriages.

Thankfully, after some smooth talking, my marriage is still intact but there are still some fish fingers that neither of us are brave enough to eat. Next morning a package arrived from the Vincent Wildlife Trust containing heavy duty bags, some cool BIOHAZARD stickers and printed instructions for posting Polecats.

After an interesting exchange at the post office counter, my roadkill

casualty was posted. A few days later, it was declared 100% Polecat; further evidence that Polecats have returned to Sussex. It's great to have them back and many farmers are welcoming them too, as they do an excellent job of dispatching Rats and Rabbits. Look out for them in your headlights.
