Selmeston School



I recently deposited at The Keep in Brighton, a cache of historical documents concerning Selmeston, on behalf of the village, regarding its history, including a hard copy of the old website. These documents can be viewed in the Accession File Number 14155.

Before doing so, I couldn't resist reading once again some of the Parish Gazettes dated between 1888 and 1901, which contained the yearly reports of the Selmeston Primary School. (In 1870 over 2 million children of primary school age had no access to schools.) The school was built in 1846, (shown by a plaque fixed on its north wall) by the Reverend Henry Latham, in memory of his wife Maria, and at the time of building consisted of just one classroom, with surrounding greenery as a playground.

By 1866 there were 47 pupils, paying a penny a week, which had risen to 63, seven years later. The Rev WD Parish had then initiated a scheme for good regular attendance, by charging parents 3 pence a week, 2 pence being returned after 200 attendances by the pupil if confirmed. A shilling extra was paid to the parents of a child who attended 400 times during the year. This experiment aroused great interest and was mentioned in the House of Commons debate on the Schools Compulsory Attendance Bill of 1880.

These yearly reports make interesting reading, here are just some of the conclusions:

1888 - Reading of New and Old Testament - Excellent The singing by ear is still very cheerful and pleasant. the songs are suitable and lively and the children seem to enjoy them, although some are nervous, timid, and shy. The sewing and knitting are well done, but the writing on paper especially is of very poor character and figures not well formed. There should be more room for marching, although the managers have taken away the gallery, if more desks are put in. I am afraid that the space for marching will be curtailed. The work up to the fourth standard is done with creditable accuracy, but the arithmetic above this standard quite a failure.

1890 - number of children 67. The boys in the fourth and fifth standards answer well in Geography. The Act to Regulate the Employment of Children in Agriculture came into effect in 1875; no child under 8 can be employed on the land unless he be its parent or guardian on land owned by them. If the child is over 8 and under 10, he must have completed 250 school attendances.

1892 - By The Elementary Education Act of 1891 children at Selmeston School will be educated for free, and no payment will be demanded. The parents of every child who is not less than 5, nor more than 14 years, shall cause each child to attend school. No child under 11 years may be taken into employment. The school has suffered very much from sickness, from which the children are now recovering. Reading is only pretty fair, there are many mistakes in spelling and arithmetic. Geography is very weak, needlework is good, and recitations are well said. The library is free to all persons residing in Selmeston and Alciston, great care must be taken with the books, on application to Miss Harber on Wednesday afternoons from 4-5. The managers will give a money prize of one shilling upon passes in reading, writing, and arithmetic upon the Inspectors next examination.

1900 - New Playground for Selmeston School, a piece of ground which was so kindly presented last year by the late Cecil Long Esq has been fenced with 6-foot oak palings at a cost of £121, sixteen shillings, and nine pence, and will be a valuable acquisition, with an improvement in sanitary arrangements. Needlework has been well taught, and the rest of the work in school appears to have made very satisfactory progress. The Organising Master expresses great satisfaction with the advance of the children, he has paid a second visit this year. Three prizes for excellence were awarded this year to Ralph, Hetty and Ethel Bettles. Workboxes were awarded for needlework to Kate Foord, Marion Hope and Bessie Sands. The school bank balance at Lewes Savings Bank amounted to £1,222 one shilling and eightpence.

Potholes

Having knocked on hundreds of doors over recent weeks I can safely say potholes are one of the biggest issues across the constituency from Ringmer to Alfriston. Not just the number on our roads at the moment but also the quality of repairs.

That is why I welcome the news from East Sussex County Council who have listened to residents and this month have changed the roads contractor after so many complaints about the quality of road repairs. The new contractor is Balfour Beaty who have taken on the £297 million contract by East Sussex County Council for the maintenance of highways assets and delivery of infrastructure services across the county.

Balfour Beatty Living Places will work alongside East Sussex County Council to maintain the county's highway network and infrastructure, including roads, pavements, drainage, streetlights, traffic lights and bridges. In addition, the company will also provide winter gritting services and deliver highway improvement schemes.

Building on the success of its 'Operational Control Hub' in Herefordshire and Southampton, the company will establish a new facility in East Sussex, using the latest in innovative technologies and in-house designed systems to provide a single source of visibility to monitor all activities in real-time, track progress of works and enable data-driven decision making to drive efficiencies across the network.

This has to be good news - not just to clear the backlog of repairs, but also the quality, as for too long road repairs have only lasted weeks. I am trying to get as many potholes repaired as

Recipe of the Month -Strawberry and Raspberry Mousse

Ingredients

170 g can Evaporated milk 4 sheets of Leaf gelatine 400 g Strawberries hulled and halved plus extra to serve 225 g Raspberries plus extra to serve 5 tbsp Caster sugar 150 ml Whipping cream

Method

Pour the evaporated milk into a medium bowl and cover and place in the freezer to chill. Soak the gelatine in cold water for 5 minutes until soft.

Puree the strawberries and raspberries and sugar in a blender until smooth (sieve, if you wish, to remove the pips).

Warm the puree gently in a saucepan. With the pan off the heat, lift the gelatine sheets from the water, squeezing out any excess, and stir into the warm puree until dissolved. Pour into a large bowl and cool to room temperature. Reserve 5 tablespoons of cream and pour the remainder into the fruit puree.

Whip the cream, with electric beaters, into the fruit puree for 1 to 2 minutes to thicken a little. Cover and chill the bowl for 30 minutes whisking 3 times during this period until thick, like milkshake.

Whip the chilled evaporated milk until very thick. Fold 2 tablespoons of this into the fruit mixture and then fold in the rest until evenly pink and fluffy.

Spoon into 6 serving dishes, cover and leave in the fridge until set. When ready to serve, whip the remaining cream until it holds its shape. Spoon or pipe on top of the mousse and decorate with the reserved berries.

June's Gardener's Diary

This month is the last chance to sow main crop Carrots for them to be ready for harvesting in September or October. Also, Peas sown early in the month should still be ready in September.

Sow Swedes if they've not already been done and French Beans can go in for a second crop. Continue to sow Beetroot, Spring Onions, Turnips, Lettuces, and Radishes with some at the beginning of the month and some near the end.

This is also the last chance to sow Runner Beans and with a bit of luck will give you a crop as late as October.

Watering is especially important in dry weather. Keep the roots of all plant moist but not soaking wet. Hopefully, this month we will be harvesting some of the early sowings - i.e. Potatoes, Radishes, Turnips, Carrots, Peas and a few more.

number was 148 so it is really encouraging to see how much we have grown during this period. Sadly, we are currently having to turn some families away as we simply do not have space either on current caseloads or on waiting lists - we hate to do this, but we need to keep our practitioners' caseloads manageable. So please do pray for all our staff and the families in need of support. We will work with them as soon as we can.

Behind the scenes things have been very busy. We have recruited two members of staff to support the volunteer and community engagement aspects of our work, one for each half of the county. This will hopefully bring new volunteers to FSW who can help practitioners with group activities as well as one-to-one support, as well as increasing the number of volunteers to help in our Eastbourne shop and the fundraising team.

Our foodbank is still very low on all items with the exception of teabags and pasta, so if you are able to help us replenish our stock levels, we would be incredibly grateful. I've only ever had one sporting hero. In the red corner, standing 6 ft 6 in and weighing in at 365 lbs, Big Daddy kept my Gran and me glued to the TV set on wet Saturday afternoons as he wrestled Giant Haystacks or Kendo Nagasaki in his sequined spandex.

In June, Stag Beetles - the big daddies of the beetle world - are emerging from the ground and getting ready to rumble. There are around 3,000 different species of beetle in Sussex and an estimated 29,000 species across Europe. Just as Big Daddy's 64-inch chest earned him a place in the Guinness Book of Records, the 2.5-inch-long Stag Beetle holds the coveted title of Europe's Biggest Beetle. And, like a 26 stone man in a spangly leotard, the adult male Stag Beetle is equally impressive and ludicrous. Its 3-segmented black and maroon armoured body is crowned with a ridiculous pair of trademark stag-like 'antlers'. They are actually modified mandible mouthparts and are used to impress the antler-less females and to grapple rival males.

Before these tiny titans step into the ring, they have to put in some long

hours in training. The beetle's larvae spend an incredible 5-6 years munching on a deadwood diet of buried logs and roots, building the bulky body that will sustain them to survive above ground. As adults they will live for just a few weeks without feeding, relving solely on the fuel tanks accumulated underground. In early summer, after pupation and transformation, they burst from the ground and go looking for a fight. I always find it incredible that these chunky, bulky beetles can fly but on warm evenings they whir through the air with the grace and subtlety of a Chinook on aerial reconnaissance for females. But if another male beats them to it that's when things get nasty. In my fantasies I imagine these beetle brawls to play out on a dead tree stump. A crowd of over-excited elderly invertebrates gather round; the grasshoppers and crickets chirping in with a chorus of "We shall not be moved" while the earthworms and earwigs chant "Eas-eh! Eas-eh!" The fighters face off before charging and locking antlers. With incredible strength a Stag Beetle can lift his opponent into the air, holding him there heroically before spectacularly body-slamming them down onto the stump.

We're fortunate that southeast England is a hotspot for these Herculean heavyweights but sadly our Stag Beetles are on the ropes. The loss of old trees from the countryside has had dramatic impacts on the survival of the beetles' underground larvae and their numbers are declining. My tip for spotting a Stag Beetle is to look for them in June in Henfield churchyard in West Sussex or around Ringmer in East Sussex.
