

July's Gardener's Diary

The vegetable plot should be really starting to stir in July! Now is the time to be nurturing the results of all your hard work from the last few months. FlexiBus

This month we have exciting news about a new Government-funded bus service going live across East Sussex that will, in particular, benefit rural villages and parishes. The Government has given East Sussex £41 million for this new service to transform bus travel locally.

FlexiBus is a new flexible, on-demand rideshare service, for areas with limited or no bus service. Residents can book a FlexiBus journey to their nearest town, train station, hospital, and other key destinations.

The county is being drawn up into ten zones and you can call or book online a FlexiBus service within your zone up to 30 minutes before you want to travel and up to 7 days in advance. Bookings can be made online, using an app or by telephone.

You can book up to five seats per trip, subject to availability and services are running from 7.00 am to 7.00 pm, Monday to Saturday. There is no timetable and there is no fixed route within your zone, it is completely flexible based on demand. You can book for other zones too, but you will need to get to the zone for pick up and drop off.

Our winter fuel fund is still being used even in these warm months as families cannot make their household budgets stretch to cover essential bills, and we are being asked to help with more and more clothing and uniform requests. The need for our work shows no sign of decreasing and we are still having to put families on waiting lists as we cannot work with them immediately. On the bright side, we have been able to close several cases recently as our help (over many years in some cases) has enabled families to reach a point where they are confident to manage on their own.

One parent sent us the following message which we wanted to share with you:

"This is just to say a massive thank you from me for all the fabulous help you have given us over the past few years. We are so grateful for all the advice, recommendations, and support. Your team are a great bunch and have shown so much dedication and kindness. We wouldn't have known half the people to contact for help and advice if it hadn't been for you. As we head into the summer, we have a busy events schedule which we hope will raise vital funding to support our activities, including our Amberley to Arundel sponsored walk on 17th August. Thank you to those who responded to our appeal for foodbank items. This has helped in the short term, but we are still way below comfortable stock levels on all items except teabags, pasta and biscuits. We would gratefully receive any donations of other items at any point, in particular tinned fruit and vegetables and tinned meat.

Recipe of the Month: Redcurrant Water Ice

Ingredients

600 ml water 225 g granulated sugar Pared rind and juice of 2 lemons (well washed first). 450 g redcurrants stripped of their stalks.

Method

Put the water, sugar and lemon rind (not yet the juice) into a heavy bottomed saucepan over a moderate heat. Stir until the sugar dissolves completely and then boil for 5 minutes. Take the pan off the heat and add the lemon juice and redcurrants. Leave it to cool and then liquidise and sieve the fruity syrup to remove the woody seeds.

Freeze the puree in a solid polythene container. When it is frozen, chip out the contents into a food processor and whiz until smooth and then refreeze. Repeat this process four times; each time you do it the ice will become smoother, greater in volume and easier to spoon out of the container.

It can be frozen for up to six weeks.

This 'monumental' task has now been completed. It is an extraordinary achievement and the fruit of many, many hours of painstaking work in the field, researching archives, mapping and then publishing the books. Some lettering was so eroded by the passage of time that it was very difficult to read. The angle of the sun or use of torches was critical. On one memorial that lay flat on the ground they used water to reveal the lettering. In addition to the task of documenting the memorials they have also carried out extensive research into the histories of the churches and their context.

The result is a set of five fascinating books which add new understanding and enable greater appreciation of the places where we live and are a valuable resource both now and into the future. Rodney and Ann have undertaken this work as a labour of love for history and heritage and as a help to the churches in making sure that memorials are recorded before they decay beyond recognition. We are extremely grateful for their systematic and thorough work, their extraordinary patient persistence, and their generosity in devoting so much of their time to this project.

A limited number of the books are available in the churches, and they can be printed to order. They cost £15 each. If you would like a copy or set of five copies, please visit the church, or contact Jane Grutchfield at benefice.administrator@berwickchurch.org.uk

The next step in this project is the production of separate histories, without the memorials, and to include Alfriston and Lullington, if they give permission, so that histories of all seven churches on the Cuckmere Pilgrim Path are completed. Rodney and Ann also working on a history of the landscape along the path.

Lived Experience of Detention at Immigration Removal Centres

In UK, it is legally permissible for someone who is not a convicted criminal to be detained indefinitely at an immigration removal centre (IRC). Most of the people so detained are eventually released into the community as it is found they do have a legitimate reason to be in the UK. This is an expensive and inhumane way for the government to manage people whose immigration status has been questioned. The 'Refugee Tales' group is campaigning for an end to indefinite detention at IRCs. Originating in the experience of volunteers of the Gatwick Detainees Welfare Association, Refugee Tales collects their stories from those who are willing to share their experiences at IRCs and presents these true stories to the public - often through the voices of others, since the ex-detainees themselves may lack fluency in English or may wish to remain anonymous.

Every year a crowd of supporters will undertake a Long Walk to draw attention to the need to end indefinite detention: this year we are walking from Crawley to Worthing, over five days.

Each evening there will be an opportunity for the public to join us for an event where a mixture of music and tales will be presented. The events are free but advance booking is required to help the organisers manage numbers. Do consider coming to St John the Evangelist's Church, Knoyle Rd, Brighton on Monday 10th July for a performance that will include 'A New Tale' as told to Guy Gunaratne. Guy is a novelist, journalist, and filmmaker. There will also be Mediterranean Disco Psychedelia music from Don Kipper who are a 7-piece ensemble playing a wide range of traditional musical forms reflecting the cultural diversity of north-east London, from Turkish and Greek Folk Music to Romani music and Klezmer.

to make it happen. I have been attending this fascinating event since 2012.

An outstanding example of Scottish commitment to low carbon technologies and 'net zero' is the City of Aberdeen. In a unique combination a private sector-led and not-forprofit company, ETZ Ltd has been formed with "... a clear ambition to reposition the North-East of Scotland as a globally recognised energy cluster focused on the delivery of net zero".

Effectively ETZ is an operational arm of Aberdeen City Council, which took the forward thinking step of committing to hydrogen very early. In practical and visible terms this support means that the City runs its entire Public Service Vehicles (PSV) fleet, including dustcarts and most other Council transport on hydrogen. The council established two city service stations for hydrogen refuelling of its fleet and are open to the public to encourage the private use of hydrogen fuel cell cars and other vehicles. A dedicated wind turbine is now located offshore of Aberdeen, which has a platform at its base just above sea level where desalinated water is electrolysed and the hydrogen that is so formed (using 'green' electricity) is shipped from the platform direct into Aberdeen.

'Green hydrogen' is potentially important for use in many industrial applications, particularly for decarbonising diesel trains, ferries, heavy plant and shipping. The key is cost. ETZ recognise that it will take time for the cost of hydrogen to come down, which will depend on scaling up of facilities for producing the gas.

The oft-repeated trope in connection with green energy infrastructure is the query: what happens when the sun does not shine. or the wind does not blow? This beas the question as to why so little attention has been paid to developing the vast reservoir of tidal energy around the UK, which is permanent, can be timed to the minute, and is simply dependent on the presence of the moon. It is expensive technology, but there was a sense at the Glasgow event that it was not being ignored and it will be surprising if some practical proposals for such tech are not developed in the near future. Meanwhile, closer to home in Eastbourne, in an astute local move, there are plans to roof-over the

present, under-utilised acres of the DGH car parking areas with solar panels. This itself is a trend which may spread and could potentially become a planning condition for any future large scale car park development.

Stinging Nettle

In the shadows under the Oak trees my enemy awaits. There are hundreds of them, huddled together in a silent, ferocious mob. With their drab green leaves and insignificant flowers, the Stinging Nettle is a joyless plant infamous only for its ability to inflict pain. "can be found by feeling in the darkest night" - cured everything from nosebleeds to leprosy. Celebrity chefs extol the virtues of vitamin-packed nettle soups, risottos, and spanakopita. And the caterpillars of our most impressive butterflies enjoy munching on nettles too. Red Admirals, Peacocks, Commas and Small Tortoiseshells all depend on them.

Halfway through the nettle patch all this is offering me little comfort. If I focus my mind, I can rise above it and the waves of pain can start to feel strangely invigorating. But not for long and I soon start frantically searching for a cure. Rubbing mashed dock leaves on my legs has soothed my stings since I was a schoolboy, so I was surprised to read that it's all a ruse. Scientists claim dock leaves are simply a placebo - and the searching and rubbing is just a distraction that numbs the pain.

Beyond the nettle patch I stumbled across an amazing glade of orchids, vibrant and stunning in the sunshine. In an instant the stinging stopped. Maybe it was all in my mind after all. Even when we are in our darkest night we need to keep pushing through the painful patches. There's something surprising and soothing awaiting us on the other side.

From the Vicarage: Churchyards

At this time of year, it is not unusual to receive complaints about the state of the churchyards, and I duly explain why they look neglected, with 'grass as high as an elephant's eye', large weeds and little evidence that anyone does anything to maintain them.

For some years now, churchyards surrounding our ancient churches have been identified as particularly important in restoring the balance of nature in an area. Quiet, peaceful, and often ancient, amount to what Olivia Graham, the bishop of Reading, equates to "a small national park". The land beyond the church gate is some of the most biodiverse in the UK because it has largely stayed untouched.

"Eight hundred years ago, pagan sites springs, wells, or woodland glades - had Christian churches built on top of them. Around the church is an area - the litten where people are buried. A couple of hundred years later, somebody decided that all churches should have a wall placed around them. Since then, they've never been ploughed, treated with chemicals or anything like that. So, you have this amazing genetic bank, which originated in whatever that habitat was 800 years ago, just sat there and it's still there. Pippa Rayner (Somerset Wildlife Trust) believes that the lack of pollution and a relative lack of human activity in churchyards makes them a much-needed sanctuary for wildlife."

Churchyards are also a unique repository of information about our past which, without help, would fall into disrepair, since fees do not cover the costs of looking after them. The headstones are the property of the next-ofkin, but the burial ground belongs to the church. The graves you see are not the only places where bodies are buried, (some have been the burial place of many thousands of people over the centuries) and permission is required from the vicar or churchwardens to plant, for example, a rosebush in someone's memory. Any digging for upgrading for electricity supply, etc, requires an archaeologist visit.

What, I wonder does God make of all this? We understand that we have a duty of care to God's acre and a responsibility to encouraging biodiversity. But God values people and not things, and so, because we are mindful that long grass may make visiting family graves difficult, we are very willing to assist by cutting extra paths.

When next you are in one of our churchyards, in this beautiful summer, look around you at the beauty of nature left to run riot, look out for oxeye daisy, yellow rattle, butterflies and humming-bird moths, and please understand that, in this consecrated ground, there is no disrespect intended to the living or the dead.


