



Cuckmere Brick Company revealed another part of our local history, as the remains are still visible on walks in Berwick, and you often see examples of the rich red bricks used in the construction of various buildings in this area. What intrigued me even more was the last sentence, describing the finding of the bones of a *Plesiosaurus dolichodeirus* (Greek - near to a lizard) during excavations of the clay in 1921. I wanted to find out what this reptile may have looked like, so made a quick scan of the Internet.



This revealed that the reptile lived between 228 and 61 million years ago, during the early Jurassic period, making it probably the oldest resident of Berwick! It was about three metres long, with a small head, and a long slender neck, having a broad turtle - like body, and a short tail and two pairs of long elongated paddles. It was a carnivore and lived in a marine environment, giving birth to live young.



The first complete skeleton was discovered in 1823 and up to the present day, palaeontologists have found 938 specimens.

#### **Neighbourhood and Local Plans**

I recently spoke at the Planning Inquiry in Ringmer against the proposed Thakeham development and explained to the planning inspector that the people of Ringmer are not against housing and in fact have taken over nine hundred new homes when all applications are totalled together but the infrastructure is creaking from sewage to GP services. Thakeham is yet another development with a starting price of £680K that will not help house local people and is in direct contrast to the Ringmer Neighbourhood Plan.

Neighbourhood Plans are voted on by local people through a referendum and say where housing can and can't go in an area. Ringmer was one of the first to get its plan done, but since the Lewes Local Plan, which is the overarching planning document for the district, went out of date, it puts the Ringmer plan out of date too.

Despite pleading with Lewes District Council to get their Local Plan back in date, they have said it will be at least 2025 until they will be able to do so and at the planning inquiry the lack of a Local Plan was the key argument the developers used for allowing their speculative application.

Wealden District is in exactly the same position having never had a Local Plan and so the villages and town within the district are at the mercy of developers as we have seen at Mornings Mill and Hindsland near Polegate.

Updating or getting a Local Plan in place is not difficult - especially now the Government is scrapping housing targets and moving to a 'Brownfield first' strategy. The South Downs National Park Authority are updating theirs right now so it doesn't go out of date in two years' time and so will continue to protect the green spaces inside the park. If they can do it so can Wealden and Lewes district councils. Indeed, other neighbouring Planning Authorities have recently successfully had their Local Plans approved with much lower housing numbers than their housing allocation with Worthing and Adur being two local examples. Adur got theirs through with just 57% of their standard method allocation by providing supportive evidence and Worthing with a 74% shortfall.

As the local MP my frustration is that we have gotten the Government to remove

housing targets and made it easier to update Local Plans, but if our local councils don't develop the local plans to say where housing can or can't go, we will not be able to halt the concreting of our green spaces.

#### **November's Gardener's Diary**

What we can do this month in the vegetable garden, is clearing any rubbish off the soil to prepare for manure or compost. The best way is to cover the ground with compost and leaves, leaving it until next year to dig in, allowing the worms to work it into the soil.

Don't forget you can plant Garlic and Broad Beans this month, so they will have a great start in the spring.

Rake up all the leaves you can for the compost heap, if you have a rotary mower try running over them to break them up and you will find they will compost down quicker.

Check the onions to see if any are rotten. If they are, throw them away, the same with potatoes.

Don't forget to raise your mower up for the last cut of the year!

#### Recipe of the Month: Pumpkin Soup

#### Ingredients

2 tbsp olive oil
2 finely chopped onions
1 kg pumpkin or squash, peeled,
de-seeded and chopped into chunks.
700 ml vegetable or chicken stock
150 ml double cream.

#### Method

Heat the olive oil in a large saucepan and gently cook the onions until soft but not coloured. Add the pumpkin or squash to the pan and continue cooking for 8 to 10 minutes, stirring occasionally until it starts to soften and turn golden.

Pour the stock into the pan and season with salt and pepper. Bring to the boil and

then simmer until the squash is very soft. Pour in the double cream, bring back to the boil and then puree with a blender.

If desired, serve with croutons and toasted pumpkin seeds. When cold, the soup can be frozen for up to 2 months.

#### Family Support Work (FSW)

I am writing this as the Harvest donations arrive thick and fast following Harvest Festival services at the start of October. The foodbank is starting to fill up nicely after a period of being rather low on stock, and we are extremely grateful to all the churches and their congregations who have been so generous during the last few weeks. More and more of our families are asking for food support now so it is wonderful to be able to provide them with help in this way.

Since September there has been a continued stream of new referrals, as the new school year brings issues to the surface that may have been hidden over the summer. We are spending a lot of time in meetings with schools, supporting parents in achieving the most appropriate help for their children so that they can thrive. One parent wrote to their practitioner earlier today after such a meeting, saying: "Thank you so much for meeting me this morning. We were able to take twelve families to Dalesdown for a weekend residential in early September, which proved to be a wonderful time with unseasonably nice weather. Activities included cake decorating, stick man craft, football tournaments and the ever-popular prize bingo!

Our charity shop in Eastbourne was closed for two days at the start of October whilst staff and volunteers carried out a refurbishment. It is now fully open for business again, but we are in urgent need of donations, particularly ladies' and men's autumn/winter clothing and children's toys and games. #### Slugs

I've had a strange fascination with slugs since I was a little boy. Back then I

believed that they were homeless snails that had lost their shells. It turns out I was right. Sort of. The whole eviction process had started as far back as the murky Mesozoic when some land snails cast off the shackles of a shell and evolved into slugs for some truly independent living. Sure, shells are great for protection and will help you to avoid drying out but they're clunky and require calcium to construct. Without them you can roam anywhere and (to namecheck another mollusc) the



The slug's shell has never been completely lost — a fragment remains hidden under their skin, a tiny, shrunken souvenir of their snail ancestry. Another link to their slimy dynasty is that all slugs, like all snails, are both male and female. As hermaphrodites, they possess both sets of sexual organs and this means that, if the situation dictates, they can go it alone and simply self-fertilise to produce their offspring. A true state of independence. Selffertilisation creates a clone - or in a slug's case hundreds of clones – but the problem with inbreeding is a lack of genetic variability. Clones all possess the same weaknesses. An entire slug population can be wiped out by the same parasites and pathogens. To produce varied and resilient offspring, most slugs go in for the more old-fashioned approach of finding a partner for a quick rustle in the undergrowth.

But one garden slug species has turned this chore into art - a flamboyant celebration of a lack of independence. The spotted and striped Leopard Slugs start their performance by chasing each other around a tree, giving each other sonic, sensuous strokes and cheeky nibbles. Then they climb, shimmy along a branch, and descend on a rope made of their own

#### From the Vicarage: 'Every Little Helps'

Yes, you've heard it many times: 'Every little helps!' Thanks to advertising by a certain supermarket chain, we hear it quite often. It is a phrase that is 'out there' and pops into our conversations easily.

At the Arlington Pop-up Museum recently the subject was the Women's Institute, but the articles that caught my eye were about wartime appeals. In particular, the story of the Spitfire Fund:

"When my mummy has taken me out and I have wanted to use a public convenience

she has had to pay a penny. So I thought if we did the same at home it would help your fund." So wrote eight-year-old Patricia Boncey to Lord Beaverbrook, Minister of Aircraft Production, to accompany her postal order for 15 shillings.

In early 1940 Lord Beaverbrook came into government to speed up aircraft production. He pushed the idea of public appeals, for example to source raw materials and to encourage thrifty shopping, in a bid to help with the war effort. Press coverage of the Spitfire brought enquiries about helping get more planes in the air, and in May 1940, Spitfire funds was established. Within weeks funds were set up by councils, businesses. voluntary organisations, and individuals. Many were co-ordinated by local newspapers, which carried lists of individual donations: "From all at No.15 Station Lane", "My week's pocket money -Fred Smith aged 7", "My first week's old age pension - 10 shillings towards our Spitfire". [BBC online] Ranging from pocket money pennies to large contributions, the donations eventually raised about £13m (£650m today's value).

In 1941 and 1942 communities across the country came together to raise money for the war effort. These fund-raising ventures allowed a community to sponsor a naval vessel through individual investments in Government Bonds and National Savings Certificates, and through the Post Office Savings Bank, so that investments were recovered with 2 ½ to 3 % interest. There were 1,178 'Warship Weeks' organised during the campaign, involving a total of 1,273 districts. [History Today website] The final total raised was £9,55611589. the equivalent of £43.1 billion today.

I am reminded of the miracle of the five loaves and two fish, when a boy offered to share his 'packed lunch'. 'As evening

approached, the disciples came to him and said, "This is a remote place, and it's already getting late. Send the crowds away, so they can go to the villages and buy themselves some food." Jesus replied, "They do not need to go away. You give them something to eat." "We have here only five loaves of bread and two fish," they answered. "Bring them here to me," he said. And he directed the people to sit down on the grass.

Taking the five loaves and the two fish and looking up to heaven, he gave thanks and broke the loaves. Then he gave them to the disciples, and the disciples gave them to the people. They all ate and were satisfied, and the disciples picked up twelve basketfuls of broken pieces that were left over.

The number of those who ate was about five thousand men, besides women and children.'
Matthew 14:15-21.
