



Andrew continued, "As a matter of fact, his mother Rachel, a schoolteacher, and his father, the Right Honourable Hilary Adair Marquand PC, have a joint headstone in Selmeston Churchyard".

†Further research reveals that Hilary was born in Cardiff 24th December 1901 and died in Hellingly on the 6th November 1972. He was the MP for Cardiff East from 1945-1950, also the Paymaster General 1947-1948, Minister of Pensions 1948-1951, and Minister of Health and a Privy Councillor, all under the then Prime Minister, Clement Attlee.

Council which is for our rural villages. This service needs to be booked a short time in advance and has no fixed route so it can take you anywhere within your local zone. It accepts concessionary and £2 bus fares, and you can book online or by phone. People who have used the service have said it is a terrific way to travel. Please do visit the East Sussex Website to find out your local zone if you are in a rural village.

Given that the £2 bus fare announced by the Government last year has been so successful they have recently announced that it will be extended to December 2024. This means bus travel will remain affordable for people and it is why it is so important that it is also accepted on the flexi bus.

For train passengers we now have the new rolling stock for the Seaford branch line which will provide more comfortable seating and toilets. Several local stations are also getting additional stops as rail passenger numbers start to increase post covid. The first is for Newhaven on the route between Brighton and Seaford. From December, there will be additional weekday stops introduced to create an hourly service all day, which is increased to half-hourly at peak times. This will improve the service for this area of Newhaven and help improve connections with the port.

You may also be interested to know that there will be stops introduced for Glynde and Berwick stations on the last train from Brighton to Eastbourne from Monday to Saturday. This currently departs Brighton at 23:32 and means that the last train of an evening from Brighton to Glynde and Berwick will no longer be the 21:56

departure, significantly improving the transport options people must stay in Brighton late into the evening.

With the news that the London travelcard is also to be retained for rail tickets to and from Sussex there are many good reasons to choose public transport for travel.

# December's Gardener's Diary

If you have not yet done it, you can lift the last of your Leeks and Parsnips before the ground gets frozen, and heel them into a trench beside a path. They will keep for months like this.

Remove the yellow leaves of all brassicas as they are no use to the plant and may harbour pests and disease. Dig over empty borders and pile manure on top to let the worms and frosts break up the clods.

You can cover heavy soil with a plastic sheet to keep it drier. This makes for easier digging in the winter.

If you want to grow something at this time of year, try mushrooms under the stairs. It's something different and they taste nice!

55 g finely chopped blanched almonds 200 g raisins 100 g currants 125 g chopped mixed peel 25 g melted butter 225 g marzipan

#### To serve

25 g melted butter 2 tbsp icing sugar

#### Method

Put the flour and sugar in a large bowl. Add the yeast on one side of the bowl and the salt on the other. Add the softened butter and 200 ml of the milk and stir together. Add the remaining milk and kneed well on a generously floured surface for 6 to 7 minutes until smooth and pliable.

Mix together the nutmeg, clove, vanilla and almond extracts, almonds, dried fruit and mixed peel in a bowl. Add the dough on top and knead from the outside into the centre. When everything has been incorporated return to the bowl, cover with cling film and leave to rise for 1 to 1½ hours in a warm place until double in size.

Flatten the dough and roll out on a lightly floured surface to a rectangle of about 45 cm by 35 cm. Brush with melted butter. Roll out the marzipan to about 25 cm by 15 cm and place on top of the dough. Roll the dough up to enclose the marzipan and transfer to a lined baking sheet. Cover and leave to rise for 45 minutes to 1 hour until risen and doubled in size.

Preheat the oven to 190°C/170°C fan/375°F/Gas 5 and bake for 1 hour. Remove from the oven, brush with melted butter and dust with icing sugar. Serve cold.

# **Holly**

I'm sure you'll agree that these are crazy times, folks. Back in Ancient Rome they had a festival -Saturnalia - which saw their society turn upside down for a week each December. It seems Saturnalian traditions of chaos and mayhem are now the daily norm for us Brits but, as we career towards Christmas, we have another thing in common with Saturnalia. We will soon be paying our respects to the Holly tree.

Holly has been celebrated in many traditions over the centuries because, as a native evergreen, its vibrancy in the dead of winter could easily be mistaken for immortality. Holly was the sacred tree of Saturn, the Roman god of agriculture. In pagan tradition, the Holly King ruled over the Oak King from Midsummer to Midwinter. Holly was easily adopted by Christians, who saw many links between the tree and the life of Christ. Today, Holly remains a centrepiece of our Christmas decorations, cards and cakes.

Each Holly tree is either male or female. While both produce delicate white flowers in May, it's only the female Holly that bears a berry as red as any blood. When these berries are produced in profusion, it's taken to be a sign of an oncoming hard winter - although in reality it's the outcome of a successful spring. Holly's prickles provide protection for nesting birds, their flower buds are food for the Holly Blue butterfly's caterpillar and their ripe berries are essential for thrushes.



If you're after a tree filled with folklore, then Holly must take a bow. So, if you're planning to deck your halls with boughs of the stuff this Christmas, here's a quick user guide.

First off, never cut down a Holly tree that's guaranteed bad luck, a superstition which has spared many Holly trees from the woodsman's axe. If you bring Holly into your home at Christmas, it'll help protect you from those pesky festive faeries. Only female Holly leaves under your pillow will allow you to predict your future in your dreams.

Oh, and don't forget to get rid of your Holly decorations before Twelfth Night (but don't burn them, that's bad luck too). Holly trees will protect you against lightning strikes (I'm not sure if this has been scientifically proven so don't blame me if you still get zapped). And don't eat the berries, they're poisonous, but if you have Smallpox, you can drink an infusion made from the leaves!

# From the Parsonage

Many years ago, I visited Bethlehem and the Church of The Nativity. I went below ground level into the confines of a richly decorated cave and was shown a silver star on the floor and told it was the spot where Jesus was born. Very few Christians remain in Bethlehem. Though it is in the West Bank and under Palestinian governance, you cannot get into the city without going through an Israeli checkpoint. The church was under siege by the Israeli Defence Force when some Palestinian militants took refuge there in 2002.

If one thinks back to the time of Christ one wonders what the atmosphere was like then, living under Roman occupation. An occupying force lives with the insecurity of uprising and will often use fear to control and suppress. The occupation generates its antagonists simply by virtue of its own existence. In His time many thought Jesus might be a leader who would liberate the people from their occupation, which was many thought the Messiah would do. Amongst his followers Jesus chose Simon. He was referred to as a 'Zealot'. Little is known about him, but the name suggests an angry, possibly extreme individual, passionate about freedom and justice for his people.

Jesus had other ideas and a different focus. Just as I went beneath ground

to see his place of birth, so He taught people to go below the surface to the root of problems. He replaced the commandment of 'an eye for eye' with 'offer the other cheek' too, for the attacker to hit. Was this Jesus' lesson in pacifism? He guided people to go into their own heart and to find their own forgiveness and healing first before doing anything else.

Whilst researching at a Commonwealth War Grave I learnt about a movement in the Second World War called 'The Silent Minute'. It was the idea of W. Tudor-Pole in 1940, and had the approval of the government. The BBC took it on board and the broadcast of Big Ben on November 10<sup>th</sup> 1940, marked the first time this silent minute was kept. The movement was revived in America after the 9/11 attach on the World Trade Centre by Dorothy Forster. A shepherd sitting on a hill, fishermen sitting by water, a Palestinian in a wheelchair cutting handheld crosses from a plank of olive wood, monks and nuns in their convents and monasteries at prayer. Does stillness and silence make any difference?

Our churches are places where one can usually keep a minute of silence with intention and focus on peace. As we enter a church, we hope to enter more deeply into ourselves. At Christmas they become places where people can go to connect, through prayer and imagination, with that place where Jesus was born, into that presence and that peace which came into our world in its brokenness and fear with power and a message of love and forgiveness.

Wishing everyone Joy and Peace this Christmas.
