April's Gardener's Diary

Now the clocks have changed and hopefully the weather's getting warmer, we can start sowing some seeds. Carrots, Beetroot, Peas, Turnips, Radish and Leeks can go in, but only if the soil is workable.

First early potatoes should be planted by now and second earlies 'chitting', ready for the middle of the month. Main crop can be planted at the end of the month.

Get your Onion sets in, when the soil is dry and if not already in, plant your shallots.

If you have Broad Beans in pots, plant them out when they start to flower, pinching out the tops to help stop blackfly.

If you have an area which is too wet to work with, cover it with black sheets and it will keep the weeds from growing, until it dries out.

A little tip for lawns with lots of moss is to get some sulphate of iron and spread over the lawn. This will kill the moss and strengthen the grasses.

Baby Loss Certificate

Losing a baby at any time is tragic. But for parents who lose a baby before 24 weeks gestation, up until now, it has been impossible to formally recognise their baby. In my role as Minister for Women's Health I recently announced the government scheme to allow parents to record and receive a certificate to provide recognition of the loss of their baby before 24 weeks gestation.

This is part of the wider work we are doing around baby loss by firstly reducing the number of still births and neo-natal deaths but also ensuring bereaved parents feel supported through their grief and recognise their loss, acknowledging their pain and ensuring they feel heard.? The new baby loss certificates will not be compulsory - it remains the choice of all parents to manage the difficult time of a loss, however they see fit.

The new baby loss certificate is available for either or both parents to register the

name and date of their baby's death and after registering this on the Government website a certificate will be sent to parents in roughly 14 days' time. It is just available in England and to start with will go back to 2018 with the intention of opening this up to all parents shortly.

Other measures as part of the baby loss review include, ending the three miscarriage rule where women had to have three miscarriages before they were entitled to medical help and now they will be assessed after a first miscarriage, ensuring that every maternity unit has a bereavement suite and access to a bereavement midwife and rolling out Early Pregnancy Units in trusts so that women having problems with a pregnancy can attend these rather than A&Es.

While nothing can take away the pain of losing a baby, the way we support parents can make a difference to how they cope. Anyone who wants to register for a baby loss certificate please follow the link below.

Family Support Work (FSW)

Time is really flying by this year, and we remain at full capacity as more and more families are referred to us weekly. It is concerning just how many are coming to us already at a total crisis, having been let down by other services, so there is a real pressure on our practitioners to provide as much support as possible.

Despite the challenges we are seeing some real progress with our families, as they begin to improve their housing, financial and confidence issues. Sadly, it is still extremely hard to get appropriate support for the many families whose children have additional educational needs, but we are not giving up and continue to press other agencies for the right help. One parent recently wrote to her practitioner to say:

"Without your commitment, understanding and sometimes firm words when needed, we honestly do not know where we would be. All three of the children have got their autism diagnoses and even though this is a little depressing for us, it was answers and being believed - something that was never in doubt"

Our family activity events are now in full swing - the Easter holidays included our first trip of the year to Arundel Castle cricket foundation and a farm trip in Midhurst where children could bottle feed lambs and take ponies for walks. Our first Dalesdown residential weekend of the year will take place in the middle of April, which we know will be another fantastic opportunity for some of our families.

I'm delighted to let you know about our new fundraising event for this year - the Cuckmere Pilgrim Path sponsored walk. Replacing our longstanding Easter Monday walk, this event will take place in the May half term holidays and allows participants to take in the seven historic churches in the Cuckmere valley as well as the fantastic scenery. We hope to see lots of you there.

Recipe of the Month: Rhubarh Fool

(Serves 3)

Ingredients

700 g rhubarb 75 g caster sugar One heaped teaspoon of grated fresh ginger (if desired) 200 ml Greek yoghurt

Method

Cut the rhubarb into chunks and place in a shallow baking dish with the caster sugar and ginger (if used) In a preheated oven - gas mark 4, 350°F, 180°C, 160° C fan - for 30 to 40 minutes.

Allow to cool and then puree in a food processor together with the yoghurt. Place in a dish or individual dishes.

Just What Happens to your General Waste, Recycling and Garden Waste?

Rosemary Norris recently attended talk in Lewes and heard details about what happens to our rubbish. The main speaker was Neil Peters who is the Lewes District Council Manager for Waste and Recycling. She writes...

Neil Peters explained that each waste vehicle visits around 1400 properties a day. All black bag rubbish is taken to the Energy Recovery Facility (ERF)

incinerator at Newhaven where it is burnt to produce steam to drive turbines to produce electricity that is then sold to the National Grid.

The recycling which is collected fortnightly is taken to a 'transfer station' which is at Lights Yard near Lewes. where it scanned and, if there is too much contamination, it is rejected and sent to the ERF. Lewes has a low contamination rate, so a large amount of the bottles/cans/cardboard does go on for recycling at Crayford in East London (just north-west of Dartford). There they have a pre-sort chamber which separates the various metals, glass, cardboard, etc - I was surprised to learn that much is done by hand with operators standing either side of a conveyor belt and picking out what is not suitable.

All recycling should be clean (wash out jars of pickle etc/ketchup bottles) as it

cannot go onto the next section if it is contaminated. Once the plastic bottles/cans/aluminium cans/cardboard, etc, have been sorted, then they are compressed into a large 'bale' and sold on the open market for processing.

Neil said that we must never put batteries in the rubbish as they cause fires - anything like an electric toothbrush/ razor/kitchen gadget that has a battery inside. These MUST be taken to a household waste site. Alternatively, most larger retailers voluntarily offer a takeback service, and stores also have a bin where you can recycle batteries.

Batteries contain Lithium and other metals which can be reclaimed as there is only a finite amount of some of these metals in the world.

The South Downs

I love heading out at the weekends for a hike over the Downs - but 90 million years ago, this part of the planet wouldn't have been a safe place to be. I'd have been busy avoiding the teeth of hungry aquatic predators like the 10-metre-long Mosasaurs as I cruised through a shallow sea.

But it would be much smaller, less fearsome prehistoric organisms that would shape Sussex. The calcium shells from microscopic marine algae slumped to the sea floor and millions of years of pressure and erosion moulded them into the curvaceous chalk hills that form the familiar foundations of the South Downs.

It only feels like yesterday (well, about 6,500 years ago) that we humans showed up and got to work. The wild Sussex woods were chopped down and eventually sheep grazing became the dominant activity on the cleared hills for many centuries. The sheep-nibbled short downland turf is an internationally rare habitat, rich in flowers and the creatures that depend on them.



And, as chalk downland is such a rare habitat, the species that live here are also uncommon. Our butterflies are a prime example. Species like the Grayling, Silver-spotted Skipper, Small Blue,

Adonis Blue (above) and Chalk Hill Blue are restricted to this special habitat.

But it's not just wildlife that benefits. Those porous chalk hills filter, store, and provide us with most of our water. They also offer loads of other free services from flood prevention to pollination and food production.

The open countryside around Sussex also offers us immeasurable physical, mental and spiritual benefits. The South Downs were designated a National Park in 2011.

While writing this article, I discovered a letter penned in 1915 by the Lewes naturalist, W. E. Nicholson, expressing concern for the future of the South Downs around Lewes, and especially the rare Adonis Blue butterfly and scarce Forester Moth that live there. I'd like to think that Mr Nicholson would be reassured to know that, more than a century later, his beloved Lewes Downs, butterflies and moths are still just where he left them and all flourishing under the care of Sussex Wildlife Trust on their reserves at Malling Down and Southerham.

From the Parsonage



Behind Selmeston church is a lane that turns into a footpath running to the back of Posturite at Berwick Station. It follows a ridge of Greensand that was formed around 115 million years ago. At Selmeston when sand was being excavated in the 1930's, possibly for local brickworks, Mesolithic items from 10,000 to 4,000 B.C. were found.

There are areas beside the lane, now largely overgrown, where the sand is loose and very fine. Children from the village used to play in these natural sandpits. Now some of this sand has been collected, washed, and placed in a bowl at the back of Selmeston church. It is there for those visiting the church to make patterns in it using the mini-tools provided. A simple contemplative and creative activity, a little like a miniature Zen Garden. The patterns, like handwriting, will be uniquely theirs.

As the sand is all one colour, the images or patterns created are only made visible by light casting shadows across its

surface. Because of this the bowl can be rotated to see how the image changes as the light falls from different directions on it.

The sand images created are like miniature landscapes whose features are seen differently according to the angle of light and time of year. Similarly, the curves, sunken paths and ancient mounds on the Downs are seen most clearly with the low slanting sun from Autumn to Spring. Light is everything when it comes to perception, and the same can be said of the spiritual dimension of life.

The bowl of sand offers a small act of creativity and the chance to reflect. Its fluidity is an expression of the flux of life. It is a symbol that the world, however permanent some things may seem, is always changing. Also, that each life flows only briefly through this world. (A sand hourglass was a popular symbol of mortality on gravestones in the 18th century.)

As images are created and then wiped clean in this bowl, so life comes and goes, but we're able to think of, and therefore place ourselves in relation to, what is unchanging and eternal, and contemplate the Eternal Home of which the church is an earthly model.

This is how people first began to think of God and their desire to share in the eternal. Christ came to fulfil that yearning and allow humanity to enter into the presence of the eternal God.

Selmeston church, like all churches, are places dedicated to this faith, where people reach out to what is true and lasting in a fragile world of flux and uncertainty and confusion. Here they have their sense of the dignity renewed and learn what is the right thing to do; how they will make their own personal mark on the world.
